

## Resources:

- Powerpoint
- Sound (for songs/YouTube clip)
- A,B,C cards printed out (one set per pair, cut up so they can hold up separate letters as answers)
- Fact file printed out (one per pair)
- Worksheet – one each for ease?
- Prizes for the quiz (Haribo?)

## Lesson Plan:

**1.** Whole class discussion (slides 2-10). Ideas for questions, facts and discussion points have been added on the notes part under each slide.

**2.** Pairwork thinking starter (slide 11) – what do the words mean and how do you think they are pronounced? Could be a think, pair, share activity.

**3.** Where is German spoken? Think, pair, share (slides 12-15)

**4.** Slides 16 – explain that we are going to learn some facts about German-speaking countries and that there will be a quiz (with prizes!) at the end.

**5.** Slide 17-19 watch the YouTube clip and answer the questions on the worksheet. Slide 18 contains the answers.

**6.** Checkpoint 1 (slide 20) – pair discussion or could be done as a whole group

**7.** Slide 20 – explain the fact file pairwork. Each pair will receive a grid to fill in and a copy of the fact file. The teacher will give them a time limit to read the fact file and answer the questions in English. You could also play them music (YouTube clips) while they work. There is a challenge set for pairs who finish first.

**8.** Checkpoint 2 (slide 21) – Teachers could use this as an opportunity to discuss the answers to the fact file pairwork. There should also be time for pairs to test each other and learn the facts ready for the quiz, as they will not be allowed notes! Pairs could decide who is learning what so they do not both have to learn everything.

**9.** Quiz (slides 22 -32) – The rules are on slide 22. Students hold up the card which shows the correct answer. Alternatively, this could be done using mini whiteboards. They must turn over fact file etc so they cannot see it!

**10.** Checkpoint 3 (slide 33) – discussion in pairs or as group if time? Students could all be asked to write the answer on a mini whiteboard or an exit ticket.
