6	Famous Austrians include Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, Arnold Schwarzenegger and the singer Falco.


Facts about Liechtenstein

Facts about German–speaking Namibia

1	The Germans colonised Namibia between 1884 and 1915, and this is why German is one of the official languages of the country.
2	German is the first language of around 300, 000 Namibians.
3	Oktoberfest (a beer festival) is celebrated in both Germany and Namibia.
4	Restaurants serve typical German food, such as Sauerkraut (picked cabbage) and Schwarzwälder Kirschtorte (Black Forest gateau, a kind of chocolate cake filled with cream and cherries).
5	The German spoken in Namibia is called 'Namdeutsch'.

Fun Facts about the German language!



- They have letters that do not exist in English e.g. *B,ä,ü,ö!*
- ALL German nouns have capital letters!
 E.g. Mann, Schokolade, Limonade (Can you give me examples in English of nouns? Which English nouns have capital letters?)
- Every noun has a grammatical gender. There are three words for THE. *DER is masculine, DIE is feminine, and DAS is neuter!* For example, a table is DER (masculine), a door is DIE (feminine) and a window is DAS (neuter).
- German has some words that do not exist in English and so we have to use the German word e.g. Wanderlust, which means 'a strong desire to travel'.
